The Agape Wigwam foundation is in, and on Wednesday, May 22nd the concrete walls are poured- Horary – Horary! The foundation contractor used ICF blocks that both look and act a lot like a big 16"x24" Lego blocks. And in case you do not know ICF stands for Insulated Concrete Forms. Therefore, YES, both sides of the basement and foundation walls are insulated as part of the ICF. The basement floor will be poured and finished off either right before or right after the Memorial Day weekend. Framing will start the week after Memorial Day as the floor and roof trusses are already on site! God Willing and with a little luck the Agape - Wigwam be completed before July and ready for young campers to use and for OUR christening by the Emmaus Community with our September Fall Men's & Women's Walks!! Get your pilgrims signed up now!!!

The volunteer labor for construction will be led by long time Emmaus member John Quinn, who of course is Anita's husband! What a great team they make! John is graciously donating his time as the general contractor to see this project to completion, which is not small task and GREATLY appreciated, especially by me. 

May God richly bless you and pour our his grace and mercy into your very soul my friends!




Interior Plans
